Major Project (briefly describe): Lovejoy HS FBLA will conduct three major projects this year.

This opportunity is for us to give back to the Hampton community and our Lovejoy HS family (faculty members kids are invited), as well as enjoy seeing the beautiful smiles on the youngsters faces. Therefore, the only other place to have this event is the 1100 hallway wing.

Pumpkin Munchkin Fest Activities include:
